TRecital Tickets

Tickets went on sale Monday, April 28. They are \$18 each and are good for all three shows. Tickets will be available at the studio from 4:30 to 7pm Monday through Thursday. Tickets will be available at the recital for cash only. Tuition and the media fee must be paid before you can purchase tickets or your dancer can appear in the recital.

Media Fees

Media fees were posted to accounts on April 22. The fee covers the professional video of all three shows, as well as backstage extras. Jay Morris Productions has done our recital video for years and always does a great job. Dancers watch the videos over and over. The video will be delivered as a downloadable and shareable link in mid-lune.





May has two special dates for the dance world: Tap Dance Day (May 25) and Lindy Hop Day (May 26).



Tap Dance

Tap dance originated in the United States in the early 1800s. When instruments were taken away from enslaved people, they turned to percussive dance. This dance intersected with clog dance, brought here by Irish

immigrants, to create Tap Dance. *Tap Dance in America* is from 1989, a time when Tap Dance was being reinvigorated through Broadway musicals, especially with tap dancer Gregory Hines.

Lindy Hop

The Lindy Hop was born in Harlem as an African American social dance. It flourished through the 1930s and 1940s. It is a fusion of many dance styles, including jazz, tap, and the Charleston. Lindy Hop also underwent

a revitalization in the 1980s. Frankie Manning, one of the original lindy hoppers, led the revitalization, teaching workshops all over the world. You may recognize elements of the Lindy Hop in today's swing dancing.
